

Fact Sheet CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging



Clients

This course is for persons requiring training to become doggers. This unit specifies the outcomes required to perform slinging techniques, including the selection and inspection of lifting gear and/or the directing of the crane operator in the movement of the load when the load is out of view of the crane/ operator for licensing purposes.

Duration

This course will be conducted over **5 (five) days**. The candidates will receive a Statement of Attainment on successful completion of the unit of competency. Successful completion of the theory assessment **MUST** be achieved before proceeding to the Performance Assessment.

Course Outcome

This unit in its current form meets state and territory licensing requirements. Any alteration will result in a unit which is not acceptable to regulators for the purpose of licensing. State/Territory OHS regulators have mandated the use of Assessment Instruments and Instructions for Assessment of this unit which have been endorsed by the national body responsible for OHS matters. Assessment may be in conjunction with the assessment of other units of competency. The use of **'simulators'** in the assessment of this unit of competency is not acceptable.

Pre-requisites

There are no pre-requisites for this unit of competency.

Delivery

The course is delivered face to face. The assessment is competency based.

Knowledge Assessment

Assessment **MUST** be conducted using the mandated assessment instrument. If you respond incorrectly to any of the questions the assessor is required to enter a result of "Not yet competent" and the candidate will not be permitted to attempt the practical assessment. **This is a closed book assessment.** Several questions throughout the assessment instrument contain multiple options. Only one option is expected to be answered in each case. The assessor **MUST** choose one (1) question from each set of options to be answered and clearly mark the selection on the candidate's assessment instrument prior to the assessment.

1. The assessor **MUST** provide each candidate with a copy of the Candidate Version of the assessment instrument at the time of assessment.
2. All candidates are to be provided **ten (10) minutes** reading time prior to commencing the assessment. During this time the candidate is allowed to ask questions about the meaning or interpretation of the questions contained in the assessment.
3. Candidates should be able to complete the assessment in **two (2) hours**. The time stated is a guide only. If a candidate cannot complete the assessment in the stated time then this needs to be considered when assessing overall competency. All questions must be answered without any assistance. You cannot use any references, books or course notes.
4. The assessor **MUST** supervise the candidate at all times during the assessment.
5. The assessor **MUST** collect the assessment instrument at the conclusion of the assessment.
6. The assessment **MUST** be conducted without access to any learning materials or other assistance
7. All assessments **MUST** be conducted in the English language.
8. Engaging an interpreter to assist a candidate who does not speak or read English is not allowed.

It is expected that candidates will respond to all marked questions and all questions without options. As the assessment is competency based, candidates **MUST** respond correctly to all the questions. Failure to respond correctly to all the questions means that candidates are to be judged “Not yet competent”.

Performance Assessment

The performance assessment should be stopped immediately if the assessor believes an unsafe act is to occur. Candidates should be able to complete the performance assessment in **two (2) hours**. The time stated is a guide only. If a candidate cannot complete the performance assessment in the stated time then this needs to be considered when assessing overall competency. The assessor **MUST** supervise the candidate at all times during the performance assessment. The assessor **MUST** collect the assessment instrument at the conclusion of the assessment. All assessments **MUST** be conducted in the English language. Engaging an interpreter to assist a candidate who does not speak or read English is not allowed.

The use of ‘**simulators**’ in the assessment of this unit of competency is not acceptable.

Resources

Specific requirements

If the assessment is conducted in a controlled environment the assessor must have a suitable means for the candidate to demonstrate the application of hazard controls, for example restricting pedestrian access.

Equipment required:

- Hazard controls, specific to the worksite
- Radio, fixed if assessment on a “live” work site
- Whistles.
- A **slewing crane** that meets state/territory regulatory requirements, accompanied by a currently certified **crane operator**
- Loose pipes – with stillage – **(minimum weight 1 tonne)**
- Steel plate **(minimum weight 1 tonne)**
- Square load – defined lifting points, multiple leg sling lift **(minimum weight 2 tonne)**
- Round load **(minimum weight 2 tonne)**, to be reeved, **not less than 5 metres long**.
- Uneven weighted load (test lift) **(minimum weight 2 tonne)**
- Slings and associated equipment sufficient for the five lifting tasks
- Sufficient **(not less than 10 mm)** fibre rope to complete the four knots, bends and hitches, estimated at 2 metres
- As a minimum, the following items must be available in an unserviceable condition:
 - FSWR sling
 - Soft sling
 - Chain sling
 - Shackles
 - Crane sling shorteners
 - Lifting ring

The assessor is to confirm that the candidate has the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) when making arrangements to conduct the assessment.
